Testing at Hospitals

- Jefferson- mobile testing sites at all major hospitals. 8a-5p. An in-network provider refers you for testing, you will be scheduled for an appointment and provided instructions about the process to be seen at Abington Hospital's Temporary Testing Site. If you do not have a PCP, you can use [JeffConnect](#) to virtually connect with Jefferson doctors through your cell phone, tablet or computer with a webcam. Download the JeffConnect app or visit [JeffConnect.org](#), available 24/7.
- Penn Medicine- 2 locations 4129 Market St. Phila and 201 King of Prussia Rd. Radnor. Need to schedule a virtual visit with PennMedicine OnDemand by calling 215-615-2222 / 267-414-2303 or using the MyPennMedicine app. Need referral from a Penn MD but accepting no referrals on a case by case basis.
 - will go to one of the testing sites if symptoms are present, will be evaluated by a MD or RN on site. If they feel COVID 19 symptoms, will have a order put in the system to be tested. All done on site.

- Lehigh Valley Health Network (do not have to be in network but must live in PA) must complete screening by one of the following ways

****If you have a worsening cough, shortness of breath, or fever over 101 for more than a few days, please seek medical attention from an urgent care or a hospital emergency department (call in advanced to tell them you have systems so they can prepare. When traveling to a testing site, wear a surgical mask over your nose and mouth. If you do not have a mask, wear a scarf over your nose and mouth

Outpatient Testing (for suspected COVID-19 patients with mild/moderate symptoms not requiring hospitalization):

- **Citizens Bank Park-1** Citizens Bank Way. Entry to the site will be one Pattison Avenue. Drivers should head south on 7th Street and turn right on Pattison Avenue. Philadelphia Police will be on-scene coordinating traffic. Will be open from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. daily. To be tested here, you must have symptoms of a fever and new onset of cough AND be either over 50 or a health care worker
- **Montgomery County-** Temple University's Ambler Campus in Upper Dublin Township 1440 East Butler Pike, Ambler, PA 19002. A link to register will be available on www.montcopa.org/COVID-19, Individuals without access to the internet or who do not have an email address can call 610- 631-3000 to register for a testing appointment. Testing is by appointment only and will only be available to first responders, healthcare workers, people who are 65 years of age or older with a fever of 99.6 degrees or higher and people with a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher who are also experiencing respiratory symptoms such as coughing and shortness of breath.
- **Rite Aid 7401 Ogontz Ave Philadelphia PA 19138-** Testing site located in parking lot outside of Rite Aid. Open 9A-5p 7 days a week. **To be tested, you must be a first responder or health care worker.** Do not have to be showing symptoms and do not need doctors note

These sites are focused exclusively on assessing patients with symptoms of respiratory infection. Individuals who present to these locations with symptoms unrelated to respiratory illness will be directed to another THUC location, or other healthcare provider, for treatment depending on the patient need.

Physicians should assess their patients to determine if testing is appropriate. At this time, the COVID-19 Assessment Sites are screening only those who:

Have fever and/or symptoms of acute respiratory illness (e.g. cough or shortness of breath)

AND

Have at least one exposure risk factor, including: Close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case

- Any international travel within 14 days
- Exposure should also be considered from domestic travel to highly affected areas, especially for persons who attended a mass gathering (e.g. a conference)
- Is at risk for severe disease (age>50 years, chronic medical conditions)
- Resides in a congregate setting (e.g. long-term care facility, shelter, group home)
- Is a healthcare worker
- Requires hospitalization for symptoms
- Is presenting with progressive acute respiratory illness with no apparent cause

If you have a patient who meets the above criteria, you can write a script for COVID-19 testing and refer the patient to one of the locations listed above to have their test completed. This will allow patients to bypass the initial assessment at the urgent care site.

Patients may also come to the urgent care sites without a script from their doctor but will be subject to the required assessment by the urgent care staff to determine if testing is appropriate.

- Patient's Demographics
- Patient's Emergency Contact person
- Patient's known cohabitants and close contacts who may have been exposed
- Patient's symptoms and duration
- Any other rule out testing
- Current quarantine status
